


Important Information

- Children age 5 and under must be accompanied all day by an adult.
- Children ages 6-12 must be supervised by a parent or leader during breaks & lunch.
- Children ages 7 and under are only eligible to attend the all-day Cloverbud session.
- 8-year-olds are welcome to register in the Cloverbud or the regular sessions.
